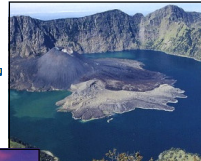


Would you like to leave our winter's cold and gray, go on a hosted

Rotary takes you to Indonesia - Bali, Java and Sumatra

Hosted; Learn the Culture. This trip is being arranged cooperatively, and hosted, by

Rotarians in the Pacific Northwest and Indonesia. In D-5100 this includes Governor Dave Jay, Water & Sanitation Coordinator Stewart Martin, and PDG Dick Elixman. In Indonesia D-3400 it includes numerous PDG's, PP's and Rotarians. If you, your club or District would like to assist, please let us know. Each traveler will have some study: a short reading list, words and phrases, and information about the geography, economy, government, religions and cultures of the areas we visit. The itinerary will include Balinese art, dance and music, fabulous temples and monkey forest; enormous Borobudur Buddhist temple and palaces in Yogyakarta, and many other sights in/near Jakarta in Java and Aceh in Sumatra.



Rotarians from our nine Pacific NW Districts will explore Indonesia with experienced Rotarians for two weeks. You will travel to the exotic islands of Bali, Java and Sumatra, learn about the history and fascinating cultures

in Indonesia, discover and work on Rotary projects, building bridges of understanding between our two great countries.

Indonesia is the 4th most populous country - as wide as the U.S., with 10,000 inhabited islands, 300 different languages, and customs which differ by region. Indonesia's

This trip is to learn about the great needs in villages of Indonesia, identify Rotary WCS project opportunities, then bring them to our Clubs and District WCS Committees for funding, grants and project completion. We look forward to Rotary matching & 3-H grants, with multi-District cooperation. Projects may include fresh water and sanitation, school and library refurbishment, malaria reduction, deforestation, health or nutritional needs. We will see firsthand devastation caused by earthquakes and tsunamis, rebuilding efforts by Rotary and other organizations, and learn how we can assist resourceful and dedicated Indonesian Rotarians helping their most needy people.

Some Rotary clubs we visit are open to "sister club" relationships.

Health, Documents. The areas we travel are generally considered safe. We will provide you guidance on personal safety, health and sanitation. *You will need a U.S. passport valid through Aug. 2008; apply ASAP.* We will assist in obtaining visas.

Ambassador, Advocate. You will be an ambassador of goodwill from America to Indonesia, a conduit of international cooperation to other Rotarians, and an advocate for Rotary projects in Indonesia on your return.

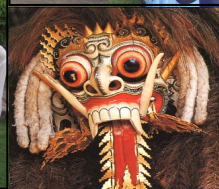

We will also see Rotary successes - projects by Rotary, including those involving Districts 5100 and 5110 - bicycles for orphans, refurbished village schools and vocational training of youth in tsunami-torn Aceh.

Travel, Cost, Lodging. We will travel by plane to and within Indonesia; ground transport (bus, van or private vehicle) will be arranged by host Rotarians. You and your spouse are both welcome. Hotels will be 4 & 5 star or boutique, with optional homestays in some areas—perhaps including a simple village home if you wish. Overall cost is about

\$3000; however we will apply for multiple Volunteer Service Grants to defray costs and share grant proceeds equitably. Optional homestays will reduce the cost. Consider asking your club to assist financially. More details as they become available.
